

JOHN CHANDLER (1525- )

John Chandler, the son of Thomas II and Agnes \_\_\_\_\_ Chandler and grandson of Thomas I was born about 1525 at Bishop's Stortford, Hertfordshire, England where he and his wife, Joan, resided throughout their lives. "He figures in the first contact between Chandler and Denison families, when he and Joan, his wife, sold a dwelling and land property in Bishop's Stortford to John Denison of Thorley (see 7-23) in 1563. His granddaughter, Margaret Chandler, married, as her second husband, John Denison's son, William Denison." <sup>1</sup> This same author states that the surname of John Chandler's wife, Joan, is unknown, as also do the pedigree charts of the 'Connecticut Society of Genealogists'.<sup>2</sup>

The DAR report gives us further details of John and Joan in the following: "He was a considerable legatee in his father's Will and also executor. John Denison was querent vs. John Chandler and his wife Joane, deforciant, for a message and land in Stortford. At a court and view of frank pledge of a manor of Stortford, held Mar. 17, 1581-2, John Chandler appears as one of the chief pledges. Children:
